Nivolumab may be administered without dilution as a 10mg/mL solution or in sodium chloride 0.9% or glucose 5% at a concentration between 1-10mg/mL over 30 minutes (240mg dose) or 60 minutes (480mg dose). Nivolumab should be administered via an infusion set with an in-line sterile, non-pyrogenic, low protein binding filter (pore size 0.2 - 1 ...
